

Hammock Stand Maintenance and Care Guide

I. Daily Maintenance

1. Pre-Use Inspection

- Check connection points (screws, hooks, welds) for looseness or rust.
- Inspect the hammock fabric for tears, fraying, or visible wear.
- Test load capacity: Apply gentle pressure to ensure the stand does not wobble or deform.

2. Proper Usage Habits

- Avoid overloading: Strictly follow the weight limit (typically 480 lbs).
- Distribute weight evenly: Sit or lie centered to prevent uneven stress.
- Keep sharp objects away: Remove keys, tools, or items that could puncture the fabric.

II. Cleaning & Care

1. Stand Components (Metal)

- Metal Stands
 - Wipe dust monthly with a dry cloth. For humid environments, use a damp cloth and dry thoroughly.
 - Check for rust quarterly: Sand affected areas and apply rust-resistant paint (e.g., outdoor-grade spray).

2. Hammock Fabric

- Routine Cleaning
 - Brush off debris (leaves, dirt) with a soft-bristle brush.
 - Spot clean stains: Use mild detergent (e.g., laundry soap) and warm water; avoid bleach.
- Deep Cleaning
 - Removable fabric: Machine wash (in a mesh bag, gentle cycle) or hand wash; air-dry in shade.
 - Non-removable fabric: Wipe with a damp cloth and air-dry; avoid direct sunlight to prevent fading.

III. Periodic Inspection & Repairs

1. Monthly Checks

- Tighten loose bolts, hooks, or fasteners with a wrench.
- For cracked welds on metal stands, consult a professional welder.

2. Seasonal Maintenance

- Post-rainy/winter season: Check for rust (metal) or mold (fabric).
- Before long-term storage: Clean and lubricate metal parts (e.g., WD-40).

IV. Troubleshooting Common Issues

1. Unstable/Wobbly Stand

- Cause: Uneven ground or improperly locked legs.
- Fix: Reposition on flat, hard ground; ensure legs are fully extended and locked.

2. Fabric Edge Wear

- Repair small tears with nylon patches or fabric glue; replace fabric if severely damaged.

3. Squeaky Metal Joints

- Apply silicone-based lubricant to reduce friction.

V. Safe Storage Tips

1. Disassembly

- Disassemble the stand for long-term storage to prevent warping.

2. Storage Environment

- Keep in a dry, ventilated area away from heat, moisture, or pests.
- Roll fabric and store in a breathable bag to prevent mildew.

VI. Safety Warnings

1. Prohibited Actions

- No jumping or exceeding the user limit (unless specified).
- Keep pets' claws away from the fabric.

2. Replacement Criteria

- Retire the hammock if the stand is bent/rusted (>30% damage) or fabric is torn extensively.
