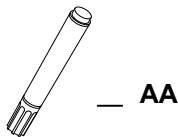

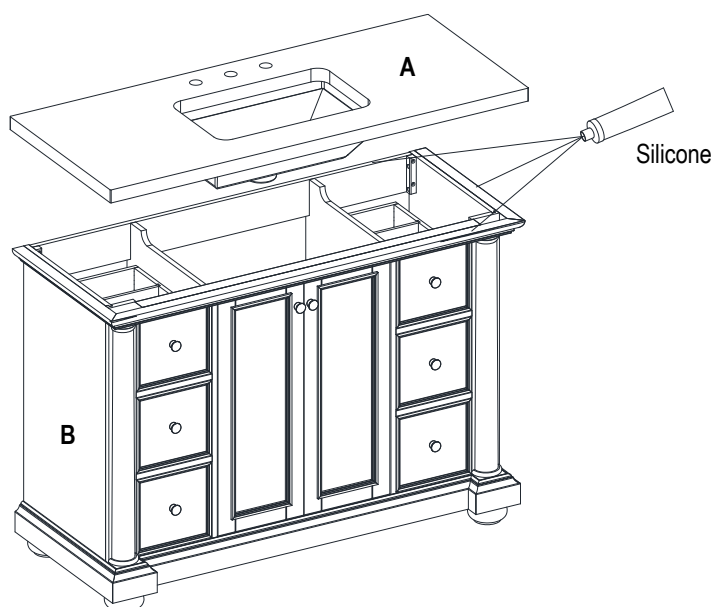
1 Removing Packaging Material

- Remove stone top and the packaging material under the stone top.



2 Stone Top Assembly

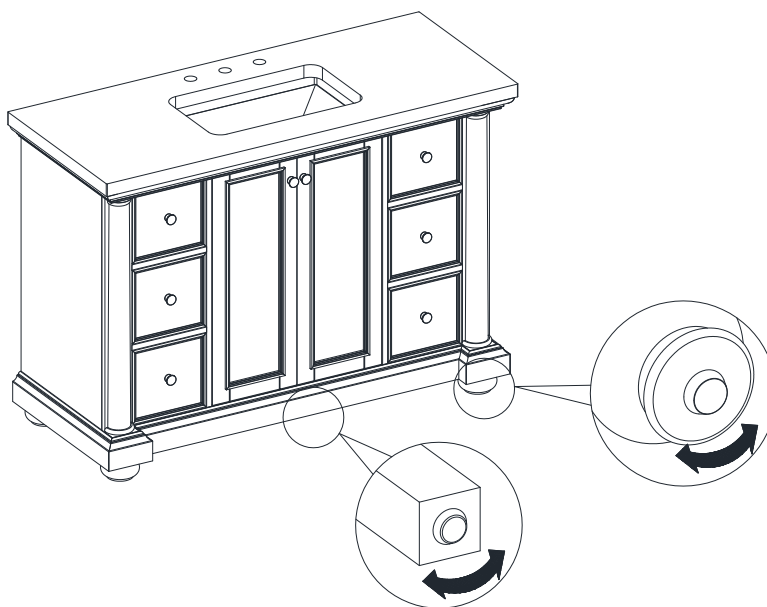
- apply a thin bead of silicone compound (not included) to the top of the vanity base (B).
- Align the back of the vanity base (B) and put the stone top (A) on the vanity base (B).

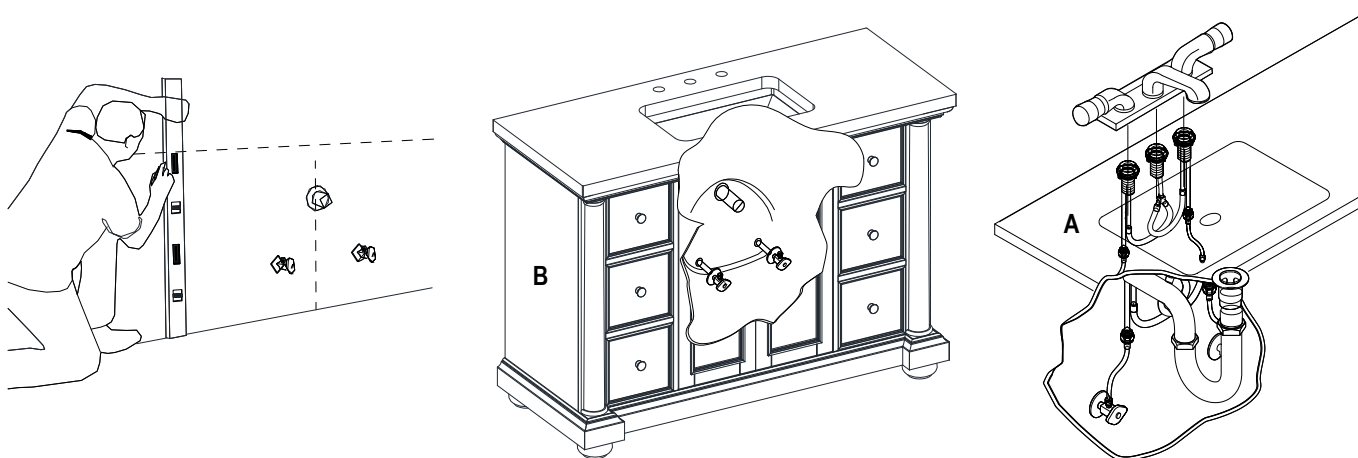
3 Adjustable Level

- In case of uneven floors, floor levelers are provided at the bottom of the vanity. If necessary, adjust floor levelers by hand to correct tilting and/or level doors.



4 Water Supply Lines and Drain Assembly Guide

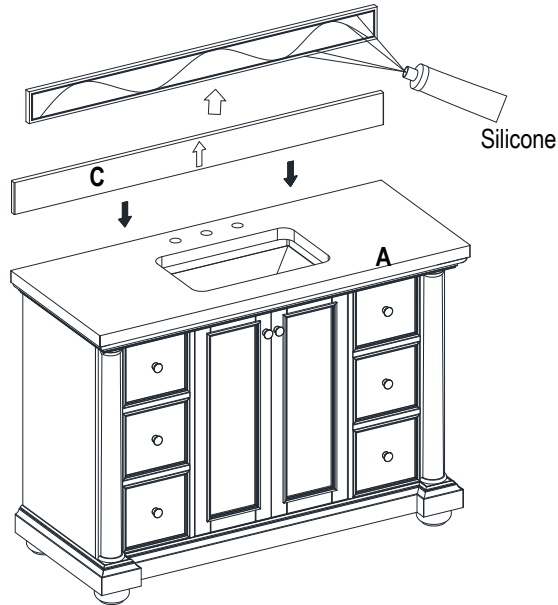
- Mark wall for vanity placement and note the location of the water supply lines and drain on the back panel of vanity.
- Move vanity (B) into proper place against the wall.
- Install faucet, drain and supply lines (none included) to vanity top (A) according to the instructions supplied with those items.

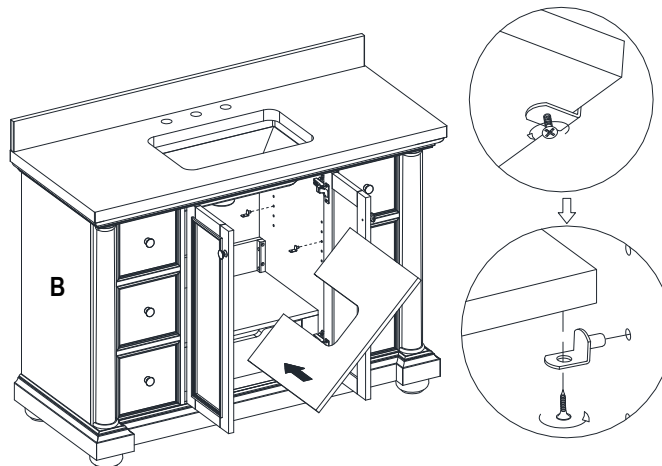
5 Backsplash Assembly

- To mount the backsplash (C) to the wall, apply a thin bead of silicone compound (not included) to the unpolished back side and bottom of the backsplash (C). Position backsplash (C) as shown onto vanity top (A) and against the wall. Clean any excess silicone compound before allowing to dry.



6 Adjustable shelf

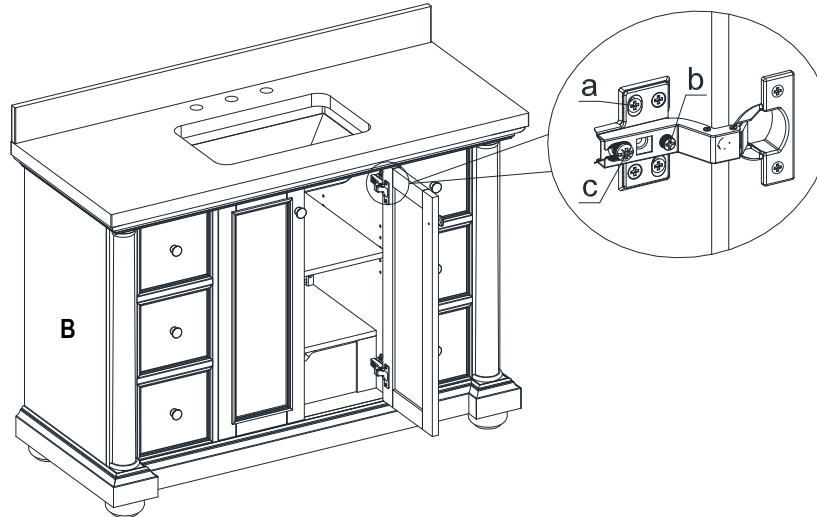
- Note: The adjustable shelves are pre-installed for shipping. If the shelf position is not to your liking, you will need to reposition the shelf by following the steps below:
 - a. Look under the shelf, and locate the wood screws holding the shelf to the shelf supports.
 - b. Remove the wood screws from each shelf support with a Phillips screwdriver (not included).
 - c. Remove the adjustable shelf from the vanity (B).
 - d. Remove the shelf supports from the vanity (B) and re-position them in the desired location. Make sure you place the shelf supports in the same level so the shelf is not tilted.
 - e. Place the adjustable shelf back onto the shelf supports.
 - f. Using the Phillips screwdriver, reinstall the wood screws through the shelf supports and into the shelf.

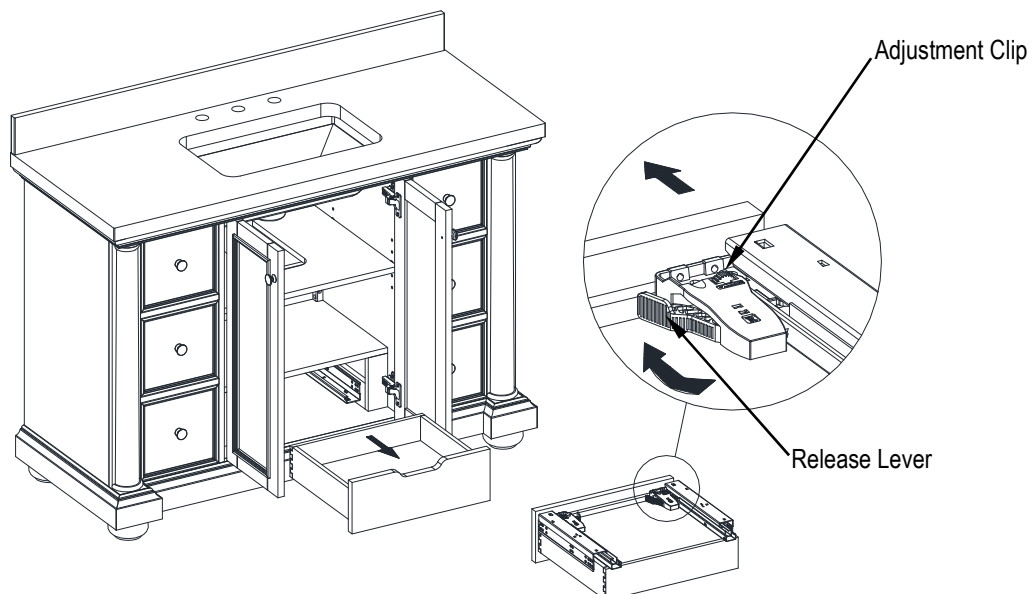
7 Hinge Adjustment For Door Alignment

- If the doors preassembled to vanity base (B) require adjustment, follow the below options as needed:
- To adjust door up or down, loosen screws (a), adjust door and retighten screws.
- To adjust door left and right, turn screw (b) in or out.
- To adjust door in and out, loosen screw (c), adjust door and retighten screw.



8 Adjust drawer

- If you need to remove the drawer, please press the Release Levers on the mechanisms pre-attached underneath the drawer kit at both ends.
- If necessary, you can push the Adjustment Clips on the bottom mechanisms to adjust the top and bottom gaps of the drawer.



Care and Cleaning

- ❑ Dust the vanity regularly with a soft, non-lint producing cloth or household dusting product.
- ❑ You can clean the vanity with a gentle, non-abrasive household cleaner. Make sure to dry the wood immediately with a soft cloth or towel.
- ❑ Tips for using touch-up pen (AA): For scratches, stroke in direction of scratch; for worn areas, stroke in direction of wood grain. Rub excess colorant promptly with a soft cloth.
- ❑ Keep product away from direct sunlight as it may damage the finish.
- ❑ Please clean all fluids from the stone surface to prevent stains. we strongly suggest that red wine spills be wiped off immediately to prevent permanent damage to the stone surface.

Maintenance & Consumer Responsibilities

Stone countertops are surprisingly resilient to stains and scratches. However, as a preventative measure, any spills on the stone surfaces should be wiped up within a reasonable amount of time. Don't let liquid sit on the stone overnight. Stones are most prone to staining by oil and acid, so be sure to blot these spills up as soon as they happen. Follow up by cleaning the stone with a mild non-abrasive soap and water.

In bathrooms specifically, stone tends to attract soap scum, just like man-made tile. Rinse vanity top with clean, hot water frequently.

The use of sealers is also a powerful preventative measure. Your stone was sealed at the factory, but reapplication is necessary over time. How often is determined by the quality of the sealer used, and the frequency of use. We recommend using a penetrating non-toxic sealer for bath areas, but a food-safe sealer is typically not necessary.

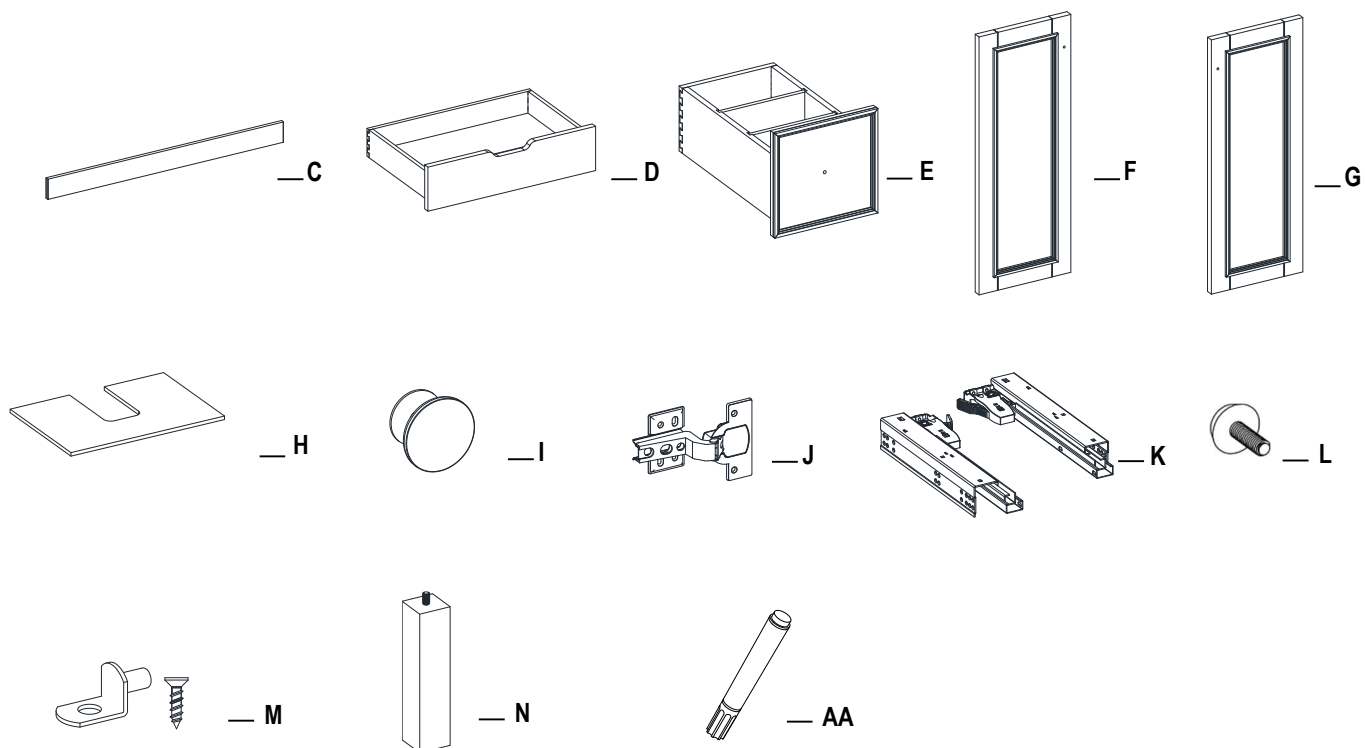
If stains and scratches do occur, there are many things you can do as a consumer to remove them. Remove oil based stains with acetone, mineral spirits, or ammonia. Organic stains like coffee, tea, or juice can be removed with hydrogen peroxide, mixed with a few drops of ammonia.

Water spots or rings are the most common problem with bath vanities, and are caused by minerals left behind when water evaporates. These can be removed by buffing the spots gently with 00 gauge steel wool. Likewise, small nicks and scratches can often be removed the same way. Larger scratches, chips, and resilient stains may require professional help. Please contact your local stonemason for details.

Remember the following list of DOs and DON'Ts:

- ❑ DO use preventative cleaning measures to keep your stone pristine.
- ❑ DO use sealers, applied according to the product specific directions.
- ❑ DO blot spills quickly, and wash with mild soap and warm water.
- ❑ DON'T use harsh bathroom cleaners or grout cleaners on any natural stone.
- ❑ DON'T worry if you get a significant stain or scratch that your stone investment is ruined. Virtually anything can be fixed with professional help.
