

Patio Privacy Screen Assembly Instructions

1. Unpacking

Upon receiving your patio privacy screen, carefully open the package. Check that all components are included. This should consist of the metal screen panels, the four expansion screws for hard - ground installation, and any other necessary hardware such as brackets or connectors. Inspect each part for any signs of damage during transit.

2. Preparation

Select the location where you want to install the privacy screen. If it's for indoor use, choose areas like living rooms, dining rooms, dressing rooms, or offices to function as dividers. For outdoor use, suitable spots include patios, balconies, gardens, decks, or pool areas. Ensure the surface is flat and clean. If installing on hard ground outdoors, make sure the area is free from obstacles that could interfere with the installation of the expansion screws.

3. Assembly of the Screen Panels

If your privacy screen comes in multiple panels, start by connecting them. Align the edges or the connection points of the panels according to the

design. Some screens may have interlocking mechanisms or require the use of provided brackets. Insert any necessary connectors or screws and tighten them securely using a screwdriver or the appropriate tool. Make sure all panels are firmly attached to form a stable structure.

- . The screen is made of high - quality metal, which is rust - resistant and fade - resistant. While assembling, handle the panels with care to avoid scratching the surface, as this could potentially affect its long - lasting performance in harsh weather conditions.

4. Installation

Indoor Installation

- . For indoor installation, you can simply place the assembled privacy screen in the desired location. If you want to secure it in place for added stability, you may use adhesive pads or lightweight mounting brackets (not included in the standard package). However, this is usually not necessary as the freestanding design is stable enough for most indoor applications.

Outdoor Installation on Soft Ground

- . If installing on soft ground, such as in a garden or lawn, you can directly place the privacy screen. Its sturdy construction and well - balanced design should allow it to stand upright without additional support. But if you

anticipate strong winds or want extra stability, you can use stakes (not provided) to anchor the screen to the ground. Drive the stakes through the pre - drilled holes at the bottom corners of the screen (if available) or use wire to tie the screen to nearby stable objects like fence posts.

Outdoor Installation on Hard Ground

When installing on hard ground, such as a patio or deck, use the four expansion screws provided. First, mark the positions on the ground where you want to install the screen. Drill holes at these marked positions using a drill bit that is compatible with the size of the expansion screws.

Insert the expansion screws into the drilled holes. Then, place the privacy screen over the screws and align the holes in the screen with the screws. Use a wrench to tighten the nuts on the expansion screws gradually. Make sure the screen is level and upright during the tightening process. The size of the screen, 48 inches long, 16 inches wide, and 76 inches high, is designed to be stable and fit most outdoor spaces.

5. Decorating

Once the privacy screen is installed, you can enhance its aesthetic appeal. The screen features timeless, versatile patterns that already add aesthetic value to your space. You can further customize it by placing potted plants around the base of the screen, hanging string lights on the frame, or attaching other

decorative items. This will create a warm and inviting atmosphere, whether you are using the screen for privacy or as a decorative backdrop.

6. Maintenance

To ensure the long - life of your patio privacy screen, periodically check for any signs of loose connections or damage. If you notice any parts becoming loose, tighten the screws or connectors. Since the screen is made of rust - resistant metal, it requires minimal maintenance. However, if it gets dirty, you can clean it with a mild detergent and water. Avoid using harsh chemicals that could damage the powder - coated finish.
