• Do not assemble on flooring or carpet-



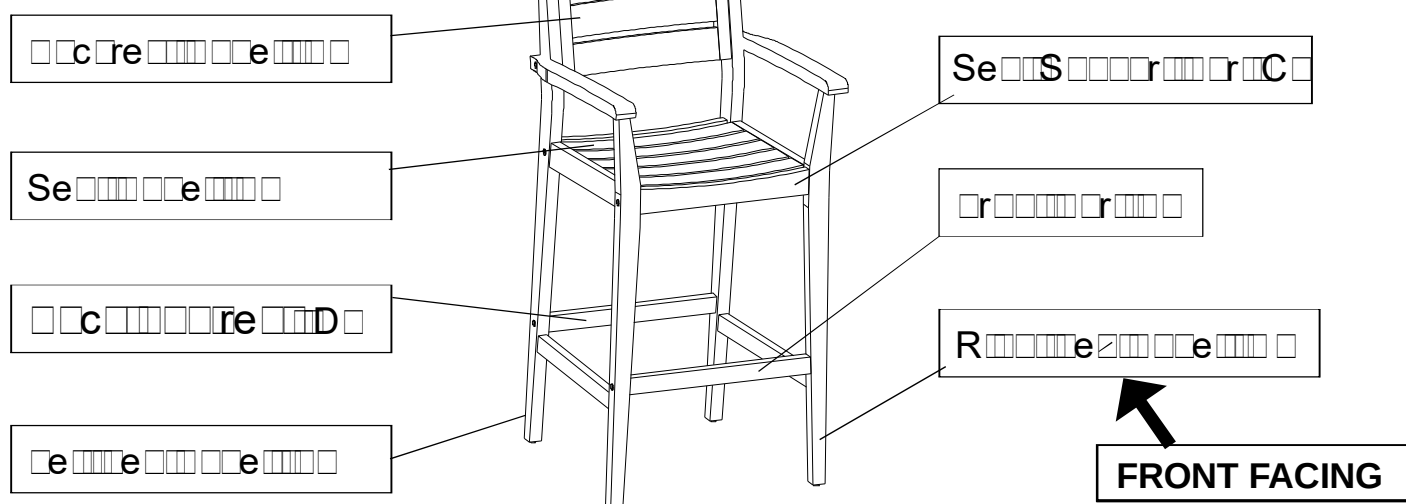
• Assemble on a clean non-marring surface (packing foam)-

1. Attach the backrest to the seat using the provided screws.

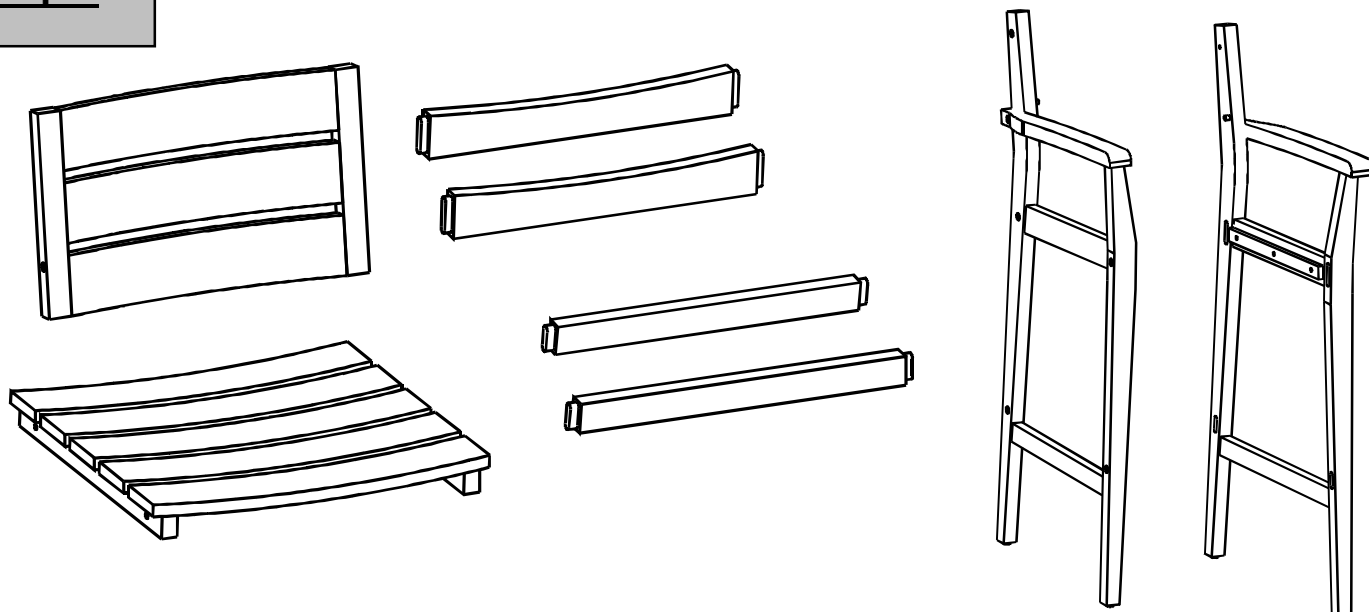
2. Attach the front legs to the seat using the provided screws.

4. Attach the armrests to the seat using the provided screws.

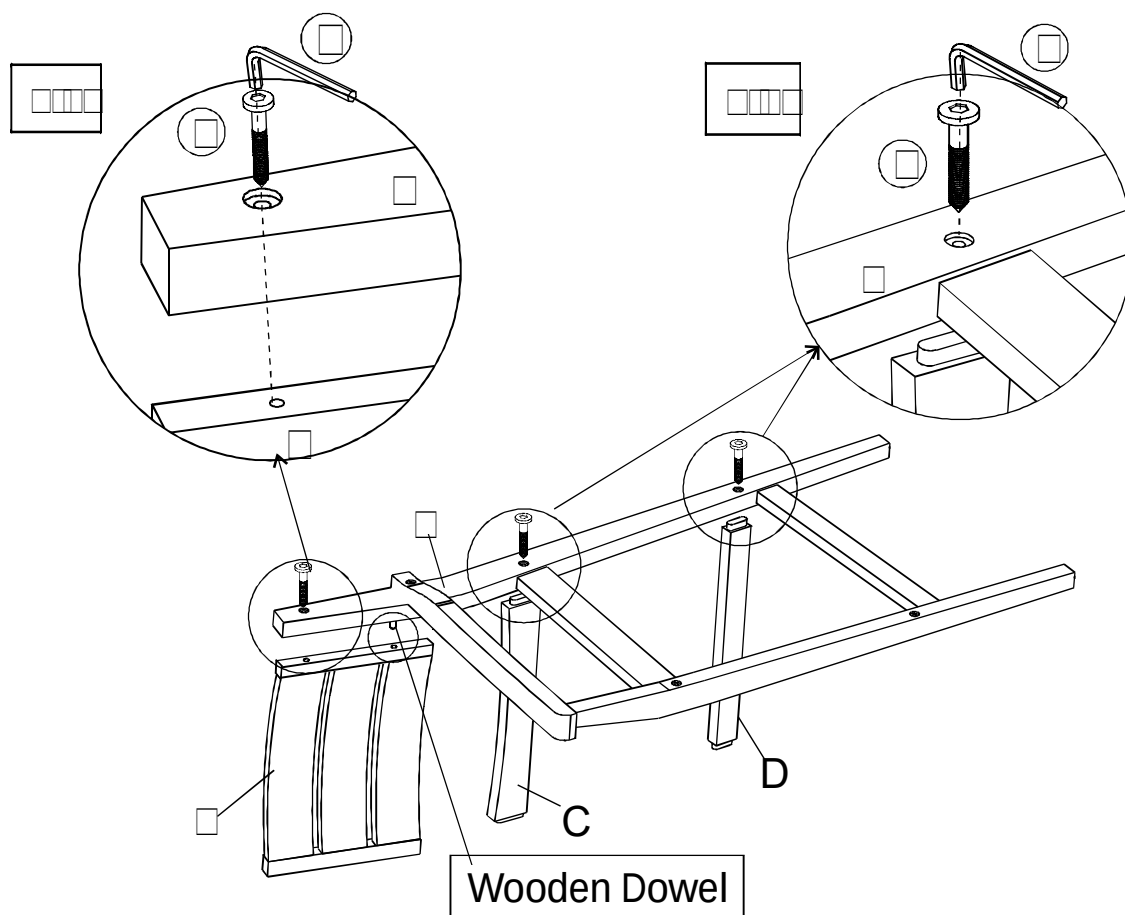
5. Attach the base to the seat using the provided screws.

Care & Maintenance

-  ● Do not put hot items directly on furniture surface.
-  ● Do not clean furniture with harsh cleansers or polish.
-  ● To obtain the longest lifespan of your outdoor products, minimizing exposure to direct sunlight is recommended.
-  ● Children should not climb or jump on the furniture.
-  ● Do not write on furniture without a padded barrier to protect the surface.
-  ● To obtain the longest lifespan of your outdoor products, avoid extended and lengthy exposure to rain, snow, and direct sunshine. Whenever possible cover the product and /or place under patio or awnings.
-  ● Not for commercial use. For residential use only.
-  ● Stains may be removed with mild soap solution and damp cloth.
-  ● Dust and pick-up spills using a clean, non-colored, lint-free cloth .

Questions & Answers about Proposition 65

What does Proposition 65 require?

Proposition 65 requires businesses to provide warnings to Californians about significant exposures to chemicals that cause cancer, reproductive toxicity, or other developmental effects. These chemicals are listed on the Proposition 65 website. Businesses must provide a warning if they know or have substantial evidence that a significant exposure to a listed chemical exists. The warning must be placed in a conspicuous location and must be in a language that is understandable to the general public.

Proposition 65 also prohibits California businesses from knowingly discharging significant amounts of listed chemicals into drinking water supplies, air, or the environment. The list of chemicals is updated annually. The list of chemicals, which was first published in 1986, has grown to include approximately 900 chemicals since it was first published in 1986.

What are the exceptions to the Proposition 65 warning requirements?

There are several exceptions to the Proposition 65 warning requirements. First, a business is not required to provide a warning if the exposure to a listed chemical is so low that it poses no significant risk of cancer or is significantly below levels observed to cause birth defects or reproductive toxicity. Second, a business is not required to provide a warning if the exposure to a listed chemical is from a source that is not under the business's control. Third, a business is not required to provide a warning if the exposure to a listed chemical is from a source that is not reasonably avoidable by the consumer.

What does the warning requirement mean?

The warning requirement means that a business must provide a warning to consumers if they are exposed to a listed chemical in a way that poses a significant risk of cancer or is significantly above levels observed to cause birth defects or reproductive toxicity. The warning must be placed in a conspicuous location and must be in a language that is understandable to the general public. The warning must also include the name of the chemical and the name of the business.
