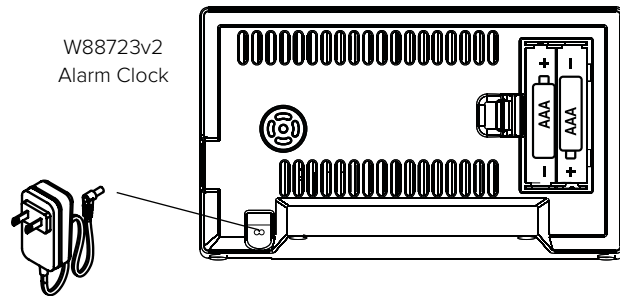

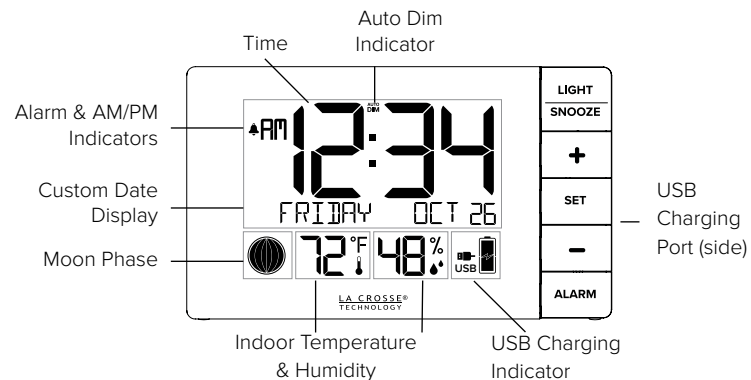

POWER UP

1. Insert the 5 volt power cord into the outlet, then into your Alarm Clock. Optional: Insert 2-AAA batteries for backup.
2. Set time, date, etc.



FEATURES



SETTINGS

1. Hold the SET button to enter the Settings Menu.
2. Use the + or - button to adjust and SET to confirm.
3. Press the LIGHT/SNOOZE button at any time to exit.

Settings menu order:

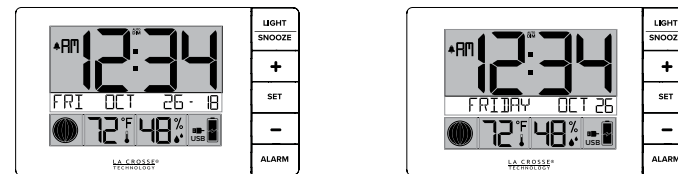
- Language (English, Spanish, French)
- Beep ON/OFF
- 12/24 Hour Time
- Hour
- Minutes
- Year
- Month
- Date
- Fahrenheit/Celsius

Note: When Español or Francais are selected, the instructions will be in the selected language.

Note: Weekday sets as Year, Month and Date are set.

CUSTOM DATE DISPLAY

Press and release the SET button to change your Date Display.



ALARM SETTINGS

1. Hold the ALARM button to enter Alarm Settings.
2. Use the + or - button to adjust values.
3. Press the ALARM button to confirm adjustments and move to the next item. The alarm is active when set.

Alarm Setting Order:

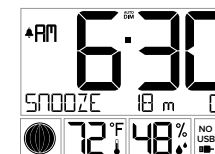
- Hour
- Minutes
- Snooze Duration

ACTIVATE/DEACTIVATE ALARM

- Press the ALARM button once to view alarm time.
- While alarm time is showing, press the ALARM button to activate or deactivate alarm.
- When active, the alarm bell will show, and will disappear when deactivated. 🔔

SNOOZE

- When alarm sounds, press LIGHT/SNOOZE button to stop the alarm and activate snooze function. SNOOZE - duration will show in date area. Alarm Icon will flash.
- During snooze count down, press any button except for LIGHT/SNOOZE to exit snooze count down
- Snooze may be repeated.

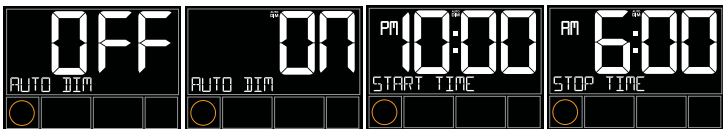


ADJUSTABLE BACKLIGHT

- Press and release the LIGHT/SNOOZE button to adjust the backlight 5 levels of intensity. OFF | 1.5% | 20% | 50% | 100%.

AUTO DIM BACKLIGHT

1. Hold the LIGHT/SNOOZE button to enter the Auto Dim settings.
2. Use the + or - button to turn the Auto Dim feature ON or OFF. Press the LIGHT/SNOOZE button to confirm.
3. If ON was selected, START TIME will flash on screen. Use the + or - buttons to adjust your Auto Dimmer's starting hour. Press the LIGHT/SNOOZE button to confirm.
4. STOP TIME will flash. Use the + or - buttons to adjust your Auto Dimmer's ending hour. Press the LIGHT/SNOOZE button to confirm and exit.



LOW BATTERY INDICATOR

- The Low Battery Indicator will show below the colon when the batteries need to be replaced in the clock.

MOON PHASE

The 12 Moon Phase icons are based on the lunar calendar and will adjust according to the year, month, and date you have set.



USB CHARGING PORT

There is a 1 Amp USB charging port on the side of your clock.

- Connect your external device's USB charging cable (not included) to the USB charging port. CHARGING will show for 3 seconds. The USB Charging Indicator will show.
- Charging times will vary.
- USB Power Output: 1A maximum current.
- Charge 1A devices or devices that are self-regulating.
