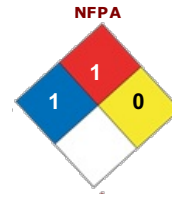

SECTION 3 - HAZARDS IDENTIFICATION

Emergency Overview: Irritant.

Potential Health Effects:

Eye: May cause irritation.

Skin: May cause irritation.
