

Installation Guide

1. Unpacking & Parts Verification

First, open the product package and confirm all components are present and undamaged. You should receive:

2 interlocking trellis sections (each with decorative elements: flowers, birds, leaves, scroll design)

11-inch ground stakes (quantity matches the trellis' stake attachment points)

2. Pre-Installation Preparation

2.1 Tools Required

No extra tools are needed—assembly uses the trellis' built-in interlocking system.

2.2 Location Prep

Select a suitable placement area based on your needs:

Outdoor (garden/lawn/large pot): Choose flat, firm soil or potting mix to ensure stability. Avoid areas with frequent strong winds.

Indoor (decor partition/ornament): Pick a ventilated, flat surface (e.g., balcony, living room corner). Skip ground stakes if placing indoors—use a non-slip pad under the trellis base if needed.

3. Step-by-Step Installation

Step 1: Assemble the Two Trellis Sections

Lay the two trellis sections on a flat, clean surface (to avoid scratching the coating).

Locate the interlocking joints on each section—these are marked by matching notches or grooves.

Align the joints carefully, then push the two sections together firmly. You'll feel a secure fit when they lock in place; gently pull to confirm no wiggling.

Step 2: Install Ground Stakes (for Outdoor Use)

Hold the fully assembled trellis upright at your chosen outdoor location.

Take the 11-inch ground stakes and insert them into the stake holes on the trellis base.

Push the stakes vertically into the soil or potting mix—insert until only 1 – 2 inches of the stake remain above the surface. This depth ensures the trellis won't tilt.

If placing in a large pot, add extra potting mix around the stakes to reinforce stability.

Step 3: Check Stability & Adjust

Lightly shake the trellis from side to side to test if it stands firmly. If it wobbles:

For outdoor use: Reinsert the stakes deeper into the soil or shift to a firmer area.

For indoor use: Adjust the trellis position or add a non-slip pad under the base.

Confirm all decorative elements (flowers, birds, leaves) are intact and not loose—no parts should be damaged during installation.

4. Post-Installation Tips

Once installed, gently guide climbing plant vines (e.g., ivy, clematis, roses) onto the trellis to help them attach and grow vertically.

Avoid hanging heavy objects (e.g., large planters) on the trellis, as this may cause deformation or instability.

If installing in cold/wet climates, check the stakes monthly to ensure they haven't shifted due to soil freezing or erosion.

5. Troubleshooting

Issue 1: Trellis sections won't lock together → Recheck joint alignment; wipe away any dust/debris on the notches, then push firmly again.

Issue 2: Stakes won't insert into hard soil → Moisten the soil slightly to soften it (avoid overwatering) before reinserting.

Issue 3: Indoor trellis slides → Use double-sided non-slip tape or a rubber pad under the base to secure it.
