

Safety Information

- To reduce the risk of electric shock, ensure electricity has been turned off at the circuit breaker or fuse box before beginning.
- All wiring must be in accordance with the National Electrical Code "ANSI/NFPA 70-1999" and local electrical codes. Electrical installation should be performed by a qualified licensed electrician.
- The outlet box and support structure must be securely mounted and capable of reliably supporting a minimum of 35 (15.9 kg) lbs. Use only UL-listed outlet boxes marked "FOR FAN SUPPORT."
- 4. The fan must be mounted with a minimum of 10 ft (3.05m). clearance from the trailing edge of the blades to the floor.
- 5. Avoid placing objects in the path of the blades.
- To avoid personal injury or damage to the fan and other items, be cautious when working around or cleaning the fan.
- Do not use water or detergents when cleaning the fan or fan blades. A dry dust cloth or lightly dampened cloth will be suitable for most cleaning.
- 8. After making electrical connections, spliced conductors should be turned upward and pushed carefully up into the outlet box. The wires should be spread apart with the grounded conductor and the equipment-grounding conductor on one side of the outlet box and ungrounded conductor on the other side of the outlet box.
- All setscrews must be checked and retightened where necessary before installation.
- 10. This device complies with part 15 of the FCC Rules. Operation is subject to the following two conditions: (1) This device may not cause harmful interference, and (2) this device must accept any interference received, including interference that may cause undesired operation.

Warranty

We warrant the fan motor to be free from defects in workmanship and material present at time of shipment from the factory for a period of lifetime after the date of purchase by the original purchaser. We also warrant that all other fan parts, excluding any glass or acrylic blades, to be free from defects in workmanship and material at the time of shipment from the factory for a period of two years after the date of purchase by the original purchaser. We agree to correct such defects without charge or at our option replace with a comparable or superior model if the product is returned. To obtain warranty service, you must present a copy of the receipt as proof of purchase. All costs of removing and reinstalling the product are your responsibility. Damage to any part such as by accident, misuse, improper installation or by affixing any accessories, is not covered by this warranty. Because of varying climatic conditions this warranty does not cover any changes in brass finish, including rusting, pitting, corroding, tarnishing or peeling. Brass finishes of this type give their longest useful life when protected from varying weather conditions. A certain amount of "wobble" is normal and should not be considered a defect. Servicing performed by unauthorized persons shall render the warranty invalid. There is no other express warranty. We hereby disclaim any and all warranties, including but not limited to those of merchantability and fitness for a particular purpose to the extent permitted by law. 



Installation

MOUNTING OPTIONS



WARNING: To reduce the risk of fire, electric shock, or personal injury, mount the fan to an outlet box marked acceptable for fan support using the screws provided with the outlet box. An outlet box commonly used for the support of lighting fixtures may not be acceptable for fan support and may need to be replaced. If in doubt, consult a qualified electrician.





NOTE: The fan must be mounted with a minimum of 10 ft. clearance from the trailing edge of the blades to the floor.


If your ceiling fan does not have an existing UL-listed mounting box, then install one using the following instructions:

- Disconnect the power by removing the fuses or turning off the circuit breakers.
- Secure the outlet box (NN) (not included) directly to the building structure. Use appropriate fasteners and materials (not included). The outlet box and its bracing must be able to fully support the weight of the moving fan (at least 35 lbs.). Do not use a plastic outlet box.

The illustrations below show three different ways to mount the outlet box (NN) (not included).










NOTE: You may need a longer downrod to maintain proper blade clearance when installing on a steep, sloped ceiling. The maximum angle allowable is 18° away from horizontal. If the canopy (C) touches the hanger ball/downrod assembly (D), then remove the decorative canopy bottom cover and turn the canopy (C) 180° before attaching the canopy (C) to the mounting bracket (A).




To hang your fan where there is an existing fixture but no ceiling joist, you may need an installation hanger bar (00) (not included) as shown above.

Assembly


Preparing the canopy

- Remove the canopy ring (B) from the canopy (C).
- Remove the two non-slotted canopy mounting screws (BB) from the canopy (C), and loosen the slotted canopy mounting screws (BB) on the canopy (C).
- Remove the canopy (C) from the mounting bracket (A) by turning the canopy (C) counterclockwise.



2 Preparing the motor

- Remove the cotter pin (FF) and clevis pin (EE), and loosen the two collar setscrews (II) from the motor collar.
- □ Take out the setscrew (HH) located in the hanger ball (PP), lower the hanger ball (PP) and remove the cross pin (GG). Remove the hanger ball (PP) from the hanger ball/downrod assembly (D).
- Remove the ground lead (QQ) from the downrod assembly (D).



3 Assembling the fan



WARNING: Failure to properly install the cotter pin (FF) could result in the fan loosening and possibly falling.




NOTE: If a longer downrod (not included) is needed, take out the screw located in the hanger ball (PP), lower the hanger ball (PP) and remove the pin (GG). Remove all three pieces from the downrod and assemble them onto the new longer downrod before proceeding to the downrod installation.



NOTE: The fan must be mounted with a minimum of 10 ft. clearance from the trailing edge of the blades to the floor.

- Carefully feed the motor wires up through the downrod (RR). Thread the downrod (RR) into the collar.
- Align the holes and replace the clevis pin (EE) and cotter pin (FF). Tighten the two collar setscrews (II).
- Slip the coupling cover (E), canopy ring (B), and canopy (C) onto the downrod (RR).
- Carefully reinstall the hanger ball (PP) onto the

downrod (RR) and reinstall the ground lead (QQ) onto the downrod (RR), being sure that the cross pin (GG) is in the correct position, the setscrew (HH) is tightened and wires are not twisted.




Assembly — Hanging the Fan

Installing the mounting bracket to the electrical box



WARNING: To reduce the risk of fire, electric shock or other personal injury, mount the fan only to an outlet box or supporting system marked acceptable for fan support and use the mounting screws provided with the outlet box.

- Pass the 120-volt supply wires through the center hole in the mounting bracket (A).
- Attach the mounting bracket (A) on the outlet box (NN) by sliding the mounting bracket (A) over the screws provided with the outlet box (NN). Note that the flat side of the mounting bracket (A) is toward the outlet box (NN).
- Securely tighten the two mounting screws.




5 Hanging the fan to the mounting bracket




WARNING: The tab in the ring must rest in the groove of the hanger ball/downrod assembly (D). Failure to properly seat the tab in the groove could cause damage to the wiring.

Carefully lift the fan motor assembly (F) up to the mounting bracket (A) and seat the hanger ball/downrod assembly (D) in the mounting bracket (A) socket. Make sure the tab on the mounting bracket (A) socket is properly seated in the groove in the hanger ball/downrod assembly (D). This will help to balance the ceiling fan.



6 Installing the safety cable

 Secure the safety cable (SS) to the building structure using a wood screw (not included).

7 Preparing the receiver and remote control



WARNING: To avoid possible electrical shock, be sure electricity is turned off at the main fuse box before wiring.





CAUTION: Do not use with a wall light dimmer switch.

If you feel you do not have enough electrical wiring knowledge or experience, have your fan installed by a licensed electrician.

This remote control unit is equipped with 16 code combinations to prevent possible interference from or to other remote units. The frequency switches on your receiver (K) and remote control (L) have been preset at the factory. Please recheck to make sure the switches on the remote control (L) and the receiver (K) are set to the same position. Any combination of settings will operate the fan as long as the switches in the remote control (L) and receiver (K) are set to the same position.

 After checking the switches, insert the receiver (K) into the mounting bracket (A) with the flat side of the receiver (K) facing the ceiling.





Assembly — Hanging the Fan (continued)

Making the electrical connections



WARNING: Check to see that all connections are tight, including ground, and that no bare wire is visible at the wire nuts, except for the ground wire.



CAUTION: Do not use with a wall light dimmer switch.



NOTE: The fan must be installed at a maximum distance of 20 ft. from the remote control for proper signal transmission between the remote control and the fan's receiving unit.

Follow the steps below to connect the fan to your household wiring. Use the plastic wire nuts (AA or MM) with your fan. Secure the plastic wire nuts (AA or MM) with electrical tape. Make sure there are no loose strands or connections.


Motor to receiver electrical connections:

- Connect the black wire from the fan to the black wire marked "TO MOTOR L" from the receiver (K).
- Connect the white wire from the fan to the white wire marked "TO MOTOR N" from the receiver (K).
- Connect the blue wire from the fan to the blue wire marked "For Light" from the receiver (K).
- Connect the gray wire from the fan to the gray wire marked "For center motor" from the receiver (K).

Receiver to house supply wires electrical connections:

- Connect the black (hot) wire from the ceiling to the black wire marked "AC in L" from the receiver (K).
- Connect the white (neutral) wire from the ceiling to the white wire marked "AC in N" from the receiver (K).

- If your outlet box (NN) has a ground wire (green or bare copper) connect it to the fan ground wires; otherwise connect the hanger ball/downrod assembly (D) ground wire to the mounting bracket (A).
- Secure each wire connection with a plastic wire nut (AA) provided with the electrical hardware.
- After connecting the wires, spread them apart so that the green and white wires are on one side of the outlet box (NN) and the black and blue wires are on the other side. Carefully tuck the wire connections up into the outlet box (NN).

Installing the canopy




WARNING: Make sure the tab on the mounting bracket (A) properly sits in the groove in the hanger ball/downrod assembly (D) before attaching the canopy (C) to the mounting bracket (A) by turning the canopy (C) until it drops into place.



WARNING: The locking slots of the canopy (C) are provided only as an aid to mounting. Do not leave the fan assembly unattended until all four canopy mounting screws (BB) are engaged and firmly tightened.

- Slide the canopy (C) up to the ceiling. Make sure you have placed the wires safely into the outlet box (NN).
- Secure the canopy (C) to the mounting bracket (A) with the four canopy mounting screws withlock washers (BB) included with your fan.
- Raise up canopy ring (B) and line up the four tabs with the four grooves on the canopy (C). Once lined up, slide the canopy ring (B) and secure it to the canopy (C) until snug.




Assembly — Installing the Glass Shade

10 Attaching the glass shade



CAUTION: Before starting installation, disconnect the power by turning off the circuit breaker or removing the fuse at the fuse box. Turning power off using the fan switch is not sufficient to prevent electric shock.

 Raise the glass shade (J) up against the 14W LED light kit (TT) and secure it to the fan by turning the glass shade (J) clockwise until snug. DO NOT OVERTIGHTEN.




Disassembling Your Fan

This fan comes with a pre-assembled rear guard (G), blade (H), and front guard (I) for your easy installation. Check that all screws are tight and securely in place.

If you need to disassemble the fan for any reason such as cleaning, follow these steps below:

- Loosen the front guard screws (LL) to disassemble the front guard (I) from the rear guard (G).
- Loosen the setscrew at the top of the blade head by using a screwdriver.
- Remove the blade (H) from the motor shaft (UU).
- □ Remove the rear guard (G) from the motor head (F) by loosening the rear guard screws (KK) from the motor head (F).



Operation

REMOTE CONTROL OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

- Install the 12V MN21/A23 battery (JJ) (included) into the remote control (L). To prevent damage to the remote control (L), remove the battery if not used for long periods.
- Restore power to the ceiling fan and test for proper operation.

HI, MED, LOW buttons: set the fan speed.

OFF button: turns the fan off.

button: turns the light on or off and also controls the brightness setting. Press and release this button to turn the light on or off. Press and hold the button to set the desired brightness. The light button has an auto-resume, it will stay at the same brightness as the last time it was turned off.

The dimming of the LED is only possible with the installation of the receiver and the use of the remote. Wall slide controls used to bypass the remotes will not be able to dim the light.

button: This button rotates the fan assembly at 3 rpm.




NOTE: The complete fan assembly is designed to rotate in one direction however, when blocked it will automatically turn to the opposite direction. The rotation change will not have any effect on the performance of the fan.




NOTE: The rotation feature is only available when the fan is in operation.

INSTALLING THE REMOTE CONTROL HOLDER

- Remove the two remote control holder plugs (DD) from the remote control holder (M). Note that the plugs have unique tabs that allow them to fit only in one hole.
- Attach the remote control holder (M) with the two remote control holder mounting screws (CC).
- Replace the two remote control holder plugs (DD) each into its own hole.









Operation (continued)

ADJUSTING THE TILT ANGLE

Remove the decor handle (WW), rubber ring (XX), and fix screw (YY). There are five fix holes in the joint (W); two are on the top, and three are on the bottom side. Select a desired angle, and insert the previously-removed fix screw (YY) to the desired fix hole and secure. Replace the rubber ring (XX) and decor handle (WW), and secure.





Care and Cleaning

Do

- Check the support connections, brackets, and blade attachments twice a year. Make sure they are secure.
 Because of the fan's natural movement, some connections may become loose over time. It is not necessary to remove the fan from the ceiling.
- Clean your fan periodically. Use only a soft brush or lint-free cloth to avoid scratching the finish. The plating is sealed with a lacquer to minimize discoloration or tarnishing.
- (Optional) Apply a light coat of furniture polish to the wood blades.
- (Optional) Cover small scratches with a light application of shoe polish.

Do not

- Use water when cleaning. Water could damage the motor, or the wood, or possibly cause an electrical shock.
- Apply oil to your fan or motor. The motor has permanently-lubricated sealed ball bearings.


Troubleshooting



WARNING: Make sure the power is off at the electrical panel box before you attempt any repairs. Refer to step 8 "Making the electrical connections" on page 11.

Problem	Solution
	□ Check the main and branch circuit fuses or breakers.
The fan will not start.	□ Check the line wire connections to the fan and switch wire connections in the switch housing.
	□ Check to make sure the frequency switches from the remote control and receiver are set to the same frequency.
	□ Make sure all motor housing screws are snug.
	□ Make sure the screws that attach the fan blade to the motor hub are tight.
	 Make sure the wire nut connections are not rattling against each other or the interior wall of the switch housing.
The fan sounds noisy.	 Allow a 24-hour "breaking-in" period. Most noises associated with a new fan disappear during this time.
	□ Make sure there is a short distance from the ceiling to the canopy. It should not touch the ceiling.
	□ Make sure your ceiling box is secure and that rubber isolator pads are used between the mounting bracket and outlet box.
The remote control is	□ Do not connect the fan with wall mounted variable speed control(s).
not working.	□ Make sure the frequency switches are set correctly.
