Vintage distressed paint livens up your counters with timeless elegance.

ITEMS:

- Rust-Oleum Chalked Paint in Serenity Blue & Linen White
- Rust-Oleum Chalked Decorative Glaze in Smoked & Aged
- Rust-Oleum Chalked Protective Topcoat in Matte Clear
- Disposable Nitrile Gloves & Clean lint-free rags
- Mason Jars
 Sandpaper
 Drop Cloth
 Painter's Tape
- (2) 2" SyntheticStir SticksGlass Cleaner

STEPS:

Prepare Always work in a well-ventilated area. Cover the floor and nearby items with drop cloths. Clean Jars with Glass Cleaner and lint-free cloth. Make sure jars are completely dry. Tape off any areas of jar you don't want to paint.

Paint

Chalked Paint: Apply Chalked Paint with light, even strokes for even flow and smoothest finish. Allow at least 2 hours before optional distressing step. To distress, use sandpaper to achieve your desired look and wipe clean with a lint free cloth.

Decorative Glaze: Brush Glaze on fully cured surface and wipe off to desired look with a lint-free cloth. Let dry a minimum of 8 hours before applying Rust-Oleum Chalked Topcoat. As shown, Smoked Glaze over Serenity Blue and Aged Glaze over Linen White.

Chalked Topcoat: To apply topcoat, brush on 1 to 2 even coats, allowing 30 minutes between each

Finish Allow the topcoat to dry for 4 hours and then set your new creations into place.
