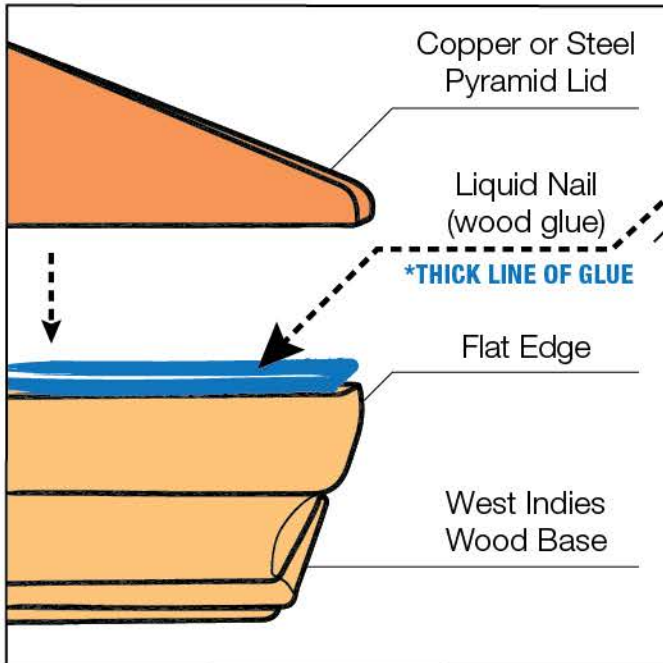


Installation Guide for West Indies Wood Post Cap w/ Optional Copper or Steel Pyramid*

Optional Copper/Steel Caps ship separately to prevent denting en route



***IF NO METAL LID WAS PURCHASED SKIP TO STEP #3 TO ATTACH WOOD CAP TO POST**

Step #1: Apply Glue to Flat Edge

Place a generous amount of **Liquid Nail** or similar outdoor glue around the top perimeter of the **Flat Edge** of the all wooden post cap base. Be generous with the amount of glue so it will make contact with the inside corner of the **Metal Lid**, once placed on top of the **West Indies Wood Base**.

Step #2: Mount Metal Pyramid Lid to Wood Base

Place the **Metal Lid** on top of the **Flat Edge** and **MAKE SURE THE GLUE MAKES CONTACT** with the metal lid. Wipe away any excess glue.

Step #3: Apply Glue to Post

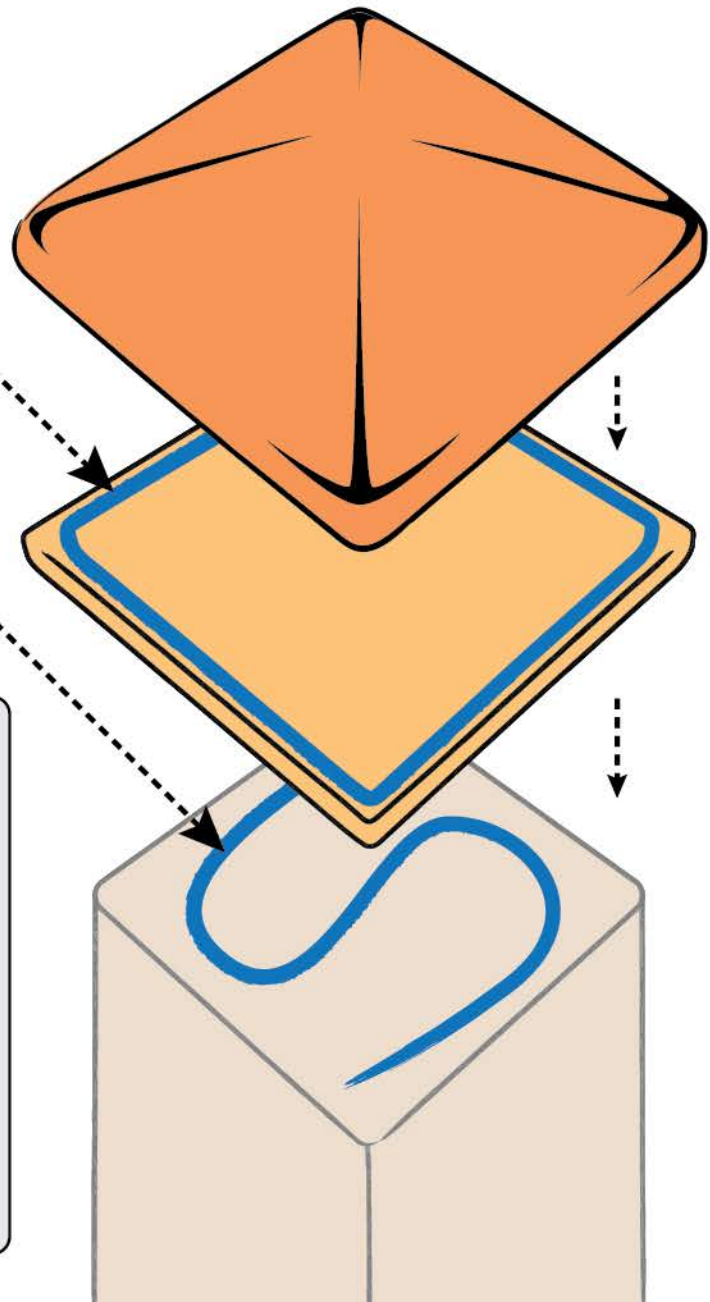
Place a generous amount of **Liquid Nail** or similar outdoor glue on top of the Post **in the shape of an "S"**. Make sure it is thick enough to spread out once you place the Post Cap on top of the post.

Step #4: Mount Post Cap to Post

Place the **Post Cap** on top of the Post where the glue has been applied. Move the cap around to completely spread the glue.

****DO NOT PUSH TOO HARD OR THE GLUE WILL FLATTEN TOO MUCH**

Make sure the Post Cap is sitting the way you want on top of the Post.



FAQ

Q: Can I screw the wood cap from the top right into the post?

A: We do not recommend screwing the post cap into the post from the top. If you decide to do this, be aware that once you glue the metal lid on top you will not be able to remove the wood cap from the post without first removing the metal lid.

Q: Can I screw from the side of the wood base into the post?

A: If you decide to do this, you should pre-drill holes in the wood cap to avoid splitting.

Q: Will the copper caps patina to a green color over time?

A: Yes, since our product is 100% copper they will patina to the green color over time.

Q: Do I have to do anything to the Stainless steel to keep it shiny?

A: No, it will remain shiny.

Q: Can the wood caps be left alone or do they need to be protected with some "sealer"?

A: Since the wood caps are Mahogany they can be left alone to weather to a gray color. If you want to preserve the "new" look then choose a coating that gives you the protection you desire. You can also paint or stain the wood caps.
