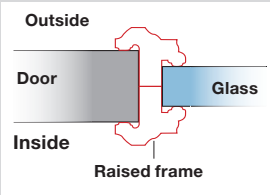




How to choose the right Add-On Blind for your door

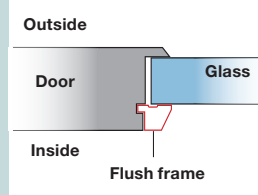
1 Determine your door glass frame type.

Raised frames



Tip: If your hand goes up and over the frame as you run it across your door, you have a raised frame.

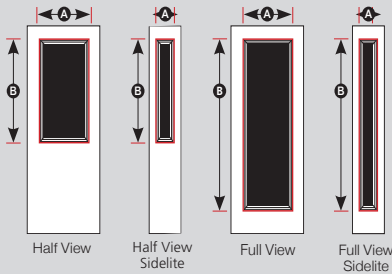
Flush frames



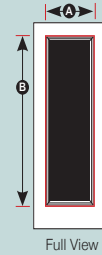
Tip: If your hand sinks down to the glass as you run it across your door, you have a flush frame.

2 Measure your door glass frame size.

Measure the outside of the door glass or sidelite frame on your steel or fiberglass door to determine blind size.



Measure the edge of the visible door glass on your steel or fiberglass door to determine blind size.



3 Choose your blind size.

*Full View Standard	23-3/4 in. – 24 in.	65-3/4 in. – 66 in.
Half View Sidelite	9-3/4 in. – 10 in.	37-3/4 in. – 38 in.
*Full View Sidelite	8-3/4 in. – 9 in.	65-3/4 in. – 66 in.
