

Do not operate hedge trimmers in explosive atmospheres, such as in the presence of flammable liquids, gases, or dust.

Service

□ Have your power tool serviced by a qualified repair person using only identical replacement parts. This will ensure that the safety of the power tool is maintained.

Hedge Trimmer Safety Warnings

DANGER – Keep hands away from blade. contact with blade will result in serious personal injury.

□ Keep all parts of the body away from the cutter blade. Do not remove cut material or hold material to be cut when blades are moving. Make sure the switch is off when clearing jammed material. Blades coast after turn off.

A moment of inattention while operating the hedge trimmer may result in serious personal injury.

□ Carry the hedge trimmer by the handle with the cutter blade stopped. Proper handling of the hedge trimmer will reduce possible personal injury from the cutter blades.

- □ Hold the power tool by insulated gripping surfaces only, because the cutter blade may contact hidden wiring. cutter blades contacting a "live" wire may make exposed metal parts of the power tool "live" and could give the operator an electric shock.
- □ Use both hands when operating the hedge trimmer. Using one hand could cause loss of control and result in serious personal injury.

Important Safety Instructions

- Do not use the battery-operated hedge trimmer in rain.
- Do not charge the battery pack in rain or in wet locations.

- □ do not use on a ladder, rooftop, tree, or other unstable support. stable footing on a solid surface enables better control of the hedge trimmer in unexpected situations.
- never allow children to operate the hedge trimmer.
- never remove or tamper with safety devices. check their proper operation regularly. never do anything to interfere with the intended function of a safety device or to reduce the protection provided by a safety device.
- never operate the hedge trimmer without proper guards, plates, or other safety protective devices in place.

□ check damaged parts before further use of the hedge trimmer. A guard or other part that is damaged should be carefully checked to determine that it will operate properly and perform its intended function. check for alignment of moving parts, binding of moving parts, breakage of parts, mounting, and any other condition that may affect its operation. A guard or other part that is damaged should be properly repaired or replaced by an authorized service center unless indicated elsewhere in this manual.

- check the blade and motor mounting bolts at frequent intervals for proper tightness. Also, visually inspect blade for damage (e.g., bent, cracked, and worn).
 Replace the blade only with a blade from the original equipment manufacturer (OEM).
- □ Replace the blade if it is bent or cracked. An unbalanced blade causes vibration that could damage the motor drive unit or cause personal injury.
- if the equipment should start to vibrate abnormally, stop the motor and deak immediately for the cause. Vibration is generally a warning of trouble.
- □ The trimmer shall be used to cut stems less than 3/4" (18mm) thick.
- □ Trim only in daylight or in good artificial light.
- Remove or disconnect battery before servicing, cleaning, or removing material from the hedge trimmer.
- Do not wash with a hose; avoid getting water in motor and electrical connections.
- When servicing use only identical replacement parts listed in this manual. Use of parts which do not meet the original equipment specifications may lead to improper performance and compromised safety.

Description

Know Your hedge trimmer (fig. 1)

The safe use of this product requires and understanding of the information on the tool and in this operator's manual, as well as knowledge of the project you are attempting. Before use of this product, familiarize yourself with all operating features and safety rules.


Hand guard

helps protect hand from cutting and deflect chips or other debris away from the operator's hands.

Front handle

For easy control of the tool during cutting work.

with overmold improves comfort and grip.



Blades

steel blades for cutting hedges and shrubs.

Blade guard

The blade guard keeps the operator from coming in contact with the sharp blades when the tool is not in use. it also helps keep the blades from being nicked or damaged when the tool is in storage.

Battery release button

Press to release the battery pack from the tool.

Latch

Locks the battery pack in place when installed on the tool.

Ejection mechanism

Aids in removing the battery.

Mounting slot

guides the battery pack.

Operation

WARNING: do not allow familiarity with this product to make you careless. Remember that a careless fraction of a second is sufficient to inflict serious injury.

WARNING: Always wear eye protection with side shields, along with hearing protection. Failure to do so could result in objects being thrown into your eyes and other possible serious injuries.

WARNING: do not use any attachments or accessories not recommended by the manufacturer of this product. The use of attachments or accessories not recommended can result in serious personal injury.

Before each use, inspect the entire product for damaged, missing, or loose parts, such as screws, nuts, bolts, caps, etc. Tighten securely all fasteners and caps and do not operate this product until all missing or damaged parts are replaced.

Application

You may use this product for the purposes listed below:

Trimming and the forming of hedges, shrubs, and bushes with a branch diameter of less than 3/4" (18mm)

To install/remove battery pack (fig. 2 & 3)

WARNING: Always remove the battery pack from the product when you are assembling parts, making adjustments, cleaning, or when not in use. Removing the battery pack will prevent accidental starting that could cause serious personal injury.


NOTE: Fully charge the battery pack before first use.

To install (fig. 2)

- Align the ribs of the battery pack with the mounting slots in the hedge trimmer's battery port.
- Press the battery pack down until t snaps into position.


NOTE: Make sure that the latch on the hedge trimmer snaps into place and the battery pack is secured to the tool before beginning operation.

To remove (fig. 3)



WARNING: Always be aware for the location of your feet, children, or pets when pressing the battery-release button. serious injury could result if the battery pack falls. Never remove the battery pack at a high location.

- Press the battery-release button the battery pack will disengage from the latch.
- grasp the battery pack and remove it from the hedge trimmer.




Holding the hedge trimmer

The unit has both a front and rear handle. With the blade directed away from you, hold the unit by both handles.

The switch lever in the front handle can be activated on any of the three sides, giving you many choices for a comfortable grip when performing cutting operations (Fig. 4, 5 & 6).


WARNING: Always keep both hands on the hedge trimmer handles. never hold shrubs with one hand and operate the hedge trimmer with the other. Failure to heed this warning may result in serious injury.



Starting/Stopping The Hedge Trimmer

Before starting the hedge trimmer:

- □ Make sure you have a secure and balance footing.
- stand upright and hold the hedge trimmer in a relaxed position.



- □ Remove the blade guard.
- Make sure the cutting blade is not touching the ground or any other objects.
- hold the unit with both hands: ore hand on the rear handle and one hand on the front handle.

To Start The Hedge Trimmer

Your hedge trimmer is equipped with two switch levers. Both switch levers need to be pressed for the hedge trimmer to start. After the battery pack is mounted, press the "On/Off" button; depress and hold the switch lever in the front handle and press the lock-off button and the switch lever in the rear handle at the same time to start the hedge trimmer.

To Stop The Hedge Trimmer

Move hedge trimmer away from cutting area, release one of the switch levers and press the "On/Off" button to stop the hedge trimmer.

WARNING: Always remove the battery pack from the hedge trimmer during work breaks and after finishing work.

Using The Hedge Trimmer

WARNING: if the blade jams on any electrical cord or line, do not touch the blade! it can become electrically live and very dangerous. continue to hold the hedge trimmer by the insulated rear handle or lay it down and away from you in

a safe manner. disconnect the electrical service to the damaged line or cord before attempting to free the blade from the line or cord. Failure to heed this warning will result in serious personal injury or possible death.

WARNING: if any parts are missing, damaged or broken, do not operate your trimmer until they have been replaced. Failure to do so could result in possibly serious personal injury.

WARNING: To prevent serious personal injury, always use both the front handle and the rear handle to hold the hedge trimmer during operation.


WARNING: To prevent serious personal injury, keep hands away from blades. do not attempt to remove cut material or hold material to be cut when the blades are moving. Make sure that the blades have totally stopped and the battery pack is removed before clearing jammed material from blades. do not grasp the exposed cutting blades or cutting edges when picking up or holding the unit.

WARNING: clear the area to be cut before each use. Remove all objects, such as cords, lights, wire, or string which can become entangled in the cutting blade and create a risk of serious personal injury.

- Before starting the hedge trimmer, maintain proper footing and balance and do not overreach. Wear safety goggles, non-skid footwear and rubber gloves. hold the unit with both hands with the cutting blades directed away from you. Always use the hedge trimmer properly.
- □ Keep from trimming too much at one time. This can cause the blades to bind and slow, reducing the cutting efficiency.
- do not force the hedge trimmer through heavy shrubbery. This can cause the blades to bind and slow down. if the blades slow down, reduce the pace of your work.
- When trimming new growth, use a wide sweeping action, so that the stems are fed directly into the cutting blade. Older growth will have thicker stems and will be trimmed most easily by using a sawing movement.
- □ Always cut stems or twigs that are less than 3/4 in. thick. Use a non-powered hand saw or pruning saw to trim large stems.


Top Cutting

Use a wide sweeping motion (see Fig. 7). A slight downward tilt of the cutting blades in the direction of motion gives the best cutting results. if desired, you can use a string to help guide you as you cut your hedge level. decide how high you want the hedge. Then, stretch a piece of string along the hedge at this height. Trim the hedge just above this guide line.



Side Cutting

When trimming the sides of the hedge, begin at the bottom and cut upwards (see Fig. 8). Trim the side of a hedge so that it will be slight narrower at the top. This shape will expose more of the hedge, resulting in a more uniform growth.



Maintenance

WARNING: When servicing, use only identical replacement parts. Use of any other parts may create a hazard or cause product damage. To ensure safety and reliability, all repairs should be performed by a qualified service technician.

CLEANING

WARNING: To avoid serious personal injury, always remove the battery pack from the product when cleaning or performing any maintenance.

- Use a soft brush to remove debris from all air intakes and cutting blade.
- □ To remove pitch and other sticky residue, spray the blades with resin solvent.

Run the motor briefly so that the solvent is event distributed.

□ Wipe the surface with a dry cloth.

WARNING: never use water for cleaning your trimmer. Avoid using solvents when cleaning plastic parts. Most plastics are susceptible to damage from various types of commercial solvents. Use clean clothes to remove dirt, dust, oil, grease, etc.

Sharpening The Cutting Blade

1. start and stop your hedge trimmer until the cutter blade and the guard are slightly offset, as shown in Fig. 9. This

will allow clearance for the file between cutter teeth and guard teeth.

- 2. Remove the battery pack from you hedge trimmer.
- clamp the blade assembly in a vise and file the exposed cutting surface of each blade tooth. Remove as little material as possible. Be sure to retain

the original angle of each tooth when filing.

- 4. Remove the hedge trimmer from the vise; restart it and stop it to expose the unsharpened edges of the blade teeth.
- 5. Remove the battery pack and repeat the sharpening procedure above.


NOTE: do not operate your hedge trimmer with dull or damaged cutting blades. This may cause overload and will give unsatisfactory cutting results.


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Lubricating the blade (fig. 10)

For best operation and longer blade life, lubricate the hedge trimmer blade with light weight machine oil before and after each use.

- 1. Remove the battery pack from the hedge trimmer.
- 2. Lay the hedge trimmer on a flat





surface. Apply a light weight machine oil along the edge of the top blade. if you will be using the hedge trimmer for an extended period, it is advisable to

stop, remove the battery, and oil the blade during use.

NOTE: do not oil while the hedge trimmer is running.

Transporting And Storing

- Always place the blade guard on the blade before storing or transporting the hedge trimmer. Use caution to avoid the sharp teeth of the blade.
- □ clean the hedge trimmer thoroughly before storing.
- store the hedge trimmer indoors, in a dry place that is inaccessible to children.
- □ Keep away from corrosive agents such as garden chemicals and deicing salts.

A WARNING: Blades are sharp. When handling the blade assembly, wear

non-slip, heavy-duty protective gloves. Do not place your hand or fingers between blades or in any position where they could get pinched or cut. NEVER touch blades or service the unit with battery pack installed.

This warranty does not cover routine maintenance parts and consumables that can wear out from normal use within the warranty period.

- a) This Warranty applies only to the original purchaser at retail and may not be transferred.
- b) The warranty period for any Henx product or part used for industrial, professional or commercial purpose is ONE year.
- c) This warranty is void if the product has been used for rental purpose.

This warranty gives you specific legal rights, and you may also have other rights which vary from state to state.


