

Lawn Sweeper Use and Care Manual

1. Introduction

2.3 Placement and Preparation Tips

- Monitor the collection bag during use. When it is 2/3 full, stop sweeping to empty it—overfilling may cause the bag to tear or debris to spill out.
- Detach the bag from the sweeper using the release clips. Empty the debris into a compost bin, trash can, or yard waste container.
- Inspect the bag for any stuck debris or damage before reattaching it to the sweeper.

3.4 Shutting Down After Use

- After sweeping, empty the collection bag completely and shake it to remove any remaining small debris.
- Clean the brush and sweeper body of any tangled grass or debris to prevent buildup.
- Store the sweeper in a dry, covered area (e.g., garage or shed) to protect it from the elements.

4. Maintenance and Care

4.1 Regular Cleaning

- **Frequency:** Clean the sweeper after each use to prevent debris buildup, which can reduce sweeping efficiency and damage components.
- **Cleaning the Brush:** Use a stiff brush or gloved hand to remove tangled grass, leaves, or twigs from the rotating brush. For stubborn debris, rinse the brush with water (if applicable) and allow it to dry completely before storage.

- **Collection Bag Tearing:** Avoid overfilling the bag. Do not sweep sharp objects (e.g., glass, metal scraps) that may puncture the bag. Replace the bag if it becomes torn or worn.
