

Maintenance of Tempered Glass Dining Table

1. Avoid Exposure to Sunlight and Rain

If your glass dining table is exposed to prolonged sunlight and rain, the sealed edges and joints can easily crack, leading to material expansion, deformation, and glass breakage. If this occurs, the table may need to be sent back to the factory for repairs.

2. Handle Items with Care

Always handle items on the glass surface gently, avoiding any forceful impacts. To prevent scratches on the glass surface, it's advisable to use a tablecloth or table mat.

3. Keep it Clean to Prevent Mold

Regularly clean the tempered glass tabletop to prevent mold from developing due to surface contamination. If mold spots appear, move the table to a well-ventilated area and use a hot iron to gently heat the affected area for 2-3 minutes until the mold disappears.

4. Promptly Wipe Away Spills

If spills, such as tea, occur on the table surface, be sure to wipe them away promptly. If left unattended for too long, these spills can leave unsightly stains. To remove such stains, sprinkle some water on the table, use aluminum foil from a cigarette box to gently rub the area, and finish by rinsing with water to remove the tea stains.

5. Use Cloth and Wax for Burn Marks

Sometimes, accidental cigarette burns on the glass surface can leave undesirable marks. To remove these burn marks, wrap a piece of cloth around a toothpick and gently rub the affected area. Then, apply a layer of wax to effectively eliminate the marks.
