

Bar Stool Care & Maintenance Guide

To ensure the longevity, appearance, and performance of your bar stool, please follow the care and maintenance recommendations below:

General Care

- Place the stool on a flat, stable surface to prevent wobbling or uneven stress on the frame.
 - Avoid prolonged exposure to direct sunlight, as it may cause fading or material deterioration.
 - Keep away from excessive moisture or heat sources to prevent warping, cracking, or corrosion.
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Cleaning Instructions

Upholstered Surfaces (Fabric / Polyester / Bouclé):

- Vacuum regularly using a soft brush attachment to remove dust and debris.
- For spills, blot immediately with a clean, dry cloth—do not rub.
- Spot clean with a mild, water-based detergent; always test on an inconspicuous area first.

Faux Leather / PU Leather:

- Wipe clean with a soft damp cloth.
- For tougher stains, use a mild soap solution and dry thoroughly afterward.
- Avoid harsh chemicals, alcohol-based cleaners, or abrasive materials.

Wood (Rubberwood / Solid Wood):

- Dust regularly with a soft, dry cloth.
- Use a slightly damp cloth for cleaning, then wipe dry immediately.
- Apply wood polish occasionally to maintain finish and prevent drying.

Metal Frame:

- Clean with a soft cloth and mild cleaner to remove fingerprints or dirt.
- Dry thoroughly to prevent moisture buildup.
- Avoid abrasive pads that may scratch the finish.

Usage Guidelines

- Do not exceed the recommended weight capacity.
 - Avoid standing or placing excessive force on the seat, backrest, or footrest.
 - Use footrests properly to reduce stress on joints and improve durability.
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Floor Protection

- Ensure all foot pads or levelers are properly installed and adjusted.
 - Check periodically for wear and replace if necessary to prevent floor damage.
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Maintenance Tips

- Periodically check and tighten all screws and hardware to maintain stability.
 - For stools with swivel or moving parts, ensure mechanisms remain clean and unobstructed.
 - Use protective covers or pads if placing near high-traffic or spill-prone areas.
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Storage Recommendations

- For long-term storage, keep the stool in a cool, dry environment.
- Cover with breathable material to prevent dust accumulation.
